NRT Mission

The New Reform Temple is a dynamic congregation that embraces a progressive and inclusive vision of Reform Judaism. While remaining deeply connected to our roots, we create opportunities for spiritual enrichment, continuing Jewish education and community engagement. We thrive on thoughtful respect for diversity of expression.

WHY RENOVATE THE NEW REFORM TEMPLE

- No Elevator—current access to lower level is via admin's office or outside steps and pathway (both worn down). No way to get to religious school if a person has any mobility challenges.
- One very small bathroom only on the main floor, No ADA compliant bathrooms in the building.
- No seating accommodations in the sanctuary for anyone with mobility challenges.
- No sprinkler system.
- Original windows—extremely energy inefficient.
- Lower level is outdated and rarely gets used.
- Mediocre AV system. Pandemic has underscored and highlighted the value of having a commercial grade AV system.
- HVAC and electrical have not been updated in 50 years.
- The current first floor layout is not inviting for social interactions before and after services and religious school.



PLANNED SCHEDULE AND FUNDRAISING GOALS

- Beginning construction in early 2021 (dependent on reaching fundraising milestone)
- Complete construction in time for Rosh Hashanah, September 6, 2021
- Budget is **\$2MM-2.4MM**

 - Krasne Room
 - Marion and Henry Bloch Religious School
 - Krasne Garden
 - o Yet, no major facelift or review of infrastructure in over 50 years

NRT RECENT DEVELOPMENTS & CONTINUED GROWTH

We continue to focus on our mission and welcome a new generation of leaders and members

- Friday night Shabbat Services have been part of our tradition since Day 1. Weekly attendance on Zoom Shabbat services now regularly exceeds 150 people
- Active Social Justice program including involvement with:
 - Mannheim Gardens
 - Jewish Family Services
 - Operation Breakthrough
 - o The Children's Place
- During the Pandemic we shifted to all on-line Shabbat Services and High Holiday Services
- Despite the Pandemic, enrollment in the Religious School is up over **20%** from 2019-20
- An inaugural year Hebrew program has 10 students
- 8 new members since June, on pace to be our biggest number of new members in at least 5 years
- An active Adult Education program featuring weekly Torah study



RENOVATION - BUILDING FOR NRT'S FUTURE

The renovation will align our building with two of our core principles, (1) inclusion & (2) to serve as a cornerstone community for the next generation of Reform Jews in KC

Facility Upgrades / Inclusions

- Expand vestibule to provide a welcoming place for Religious School parents to congregate
- Improve building accessibility on all levels with an elevator for those with limited mobility
- Complete ADA compliance
- Improve general infrastructure, safety and energy efficiency improvements
- Upgrade HVAC, windows, electrical system and security, sprinkler system installation

Facility for the Future

- Improve community space
 - Make Krasne Garden more inviting to serve as an additional location to congregate socially
 - Reconstruct and modernize lower level
- Provide enhanced Audio-Visual capabilities Pandemic has highlighted the importance of remote broadcasting
- Add new AV to Marion and Henry Bloch Religious School classrooms to facilitate teaching and learning






OUR NEW NRT - THE BIMAH




OUR NEW NRT - SANCTUARY SECTION




OUR NEW NRT - MAIN FLOOR PLANS

PLANNED SCHEDULE AND FUNDRAISING GOALS

- Beginning construction in early 2021 (dependent on reaching fundraising milestone)
- Complete construction in time for Rosh Hashanah, September 6, 2021
- Budget is **\$2MM-2.4MM**
 - Requesting commitments of 90% before beginning construction
 - Pledges payable for up to 5-year period
 - Dedication opportunities are available
- Currently raised over \$1.65MM, over 2/3 of our goal.
